William Hinton a Seaman belonging to the ship Dragon Having served three years in the [illegible word] the time of his Enlistment is hereby Discharged from the service given from under my hand this 7<sup>th</sup> day of march [year illegible in online image] James Markham [pension application R72]  
a Copsy J. Pendleton Sr.

Please to grant a Certifycate for what land I may be Entitled to unto Mr Joseph Sanders and this my note  
Shall Be your Discharge William Hinton  
Witness/ Henry Fleet/ [?] Merewather July 3<sup>rd</sup> 1783

NOTE: It appears that all but one year of William Hinton's enlistment was actually served by his slave, Lewis Hinton. Refer to the latter's pension application S10831.
