Virginia Bounty-Land Application of Francis Bundy VAS1074

THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof Francis Bundy, Soldier in the first Virginia regiment, having faithfully served the United States from the 10th of March 1781 to this date and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 9th July 1783


By order of the secretary [signed illegibly by Benjamin Lincoln]

Registered in the books of the regiment, William Eskridge Lt adjutant

War office 1783.

THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace; previous to which time, and until proclamation thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough B. LINCOLN

Certified that Francis Bundy has only received four months pay since the 1st January 1782
1st July 1783 [Abraham Kirkpatrick Capt]
