Virginia Bounty-Land Application of William Jones VAS1094

Land Office July 28th 1832.

I certy, that it does not appear from the Records in this office, that a Land Warrant for Military Services ever issued to William Jones as a Seaman. [signed illegibly]

I certify that it does not appear from the records of the Land office of Virginia that any military Land bounty has yet ever been issued to any person named Billy or William Jones but a warrant for 200 acres issued to Wm Jones as a Private who enlisted in the State Line during the war; & another warrant to Wm Jones of 200 acres, who enlisted in the Continental Line during the war; & another warrant of 400 acres issued to Wm Jones as a Corporal in the Continental Line who enlisted during the war; & another warrant of 100 acres issued to Wm Jones as a Sergeant in the Continental Line; & another warrant for 100 acres issued to Wm Jones as a Private who served in the State Line for 3 years; & one other warrant of 200 acres issued to Wm Jones who enlisted for the war in the Virginia Regim't. in Continental establishment Wm [last name and title illegible]/ (July 21[?] 1836)

NOTE: The file card indicates that William Jones was from Fredericksburg VA. The 1830 federal census of Fredericksburg lists William Jones as head of a household of free persons of color.
