[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

I do with the advice of the Council hereby Certify that Margaret Kremer widow of Michael Kremer, who was a Private in the 10th Virginia Regiment, and died in the Service of the United States, is entitled to the Sum of Eight Pounds per year commencing from the first day of January 1786.

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia at Richmond this 19th day of December 1786

Ordered that it be Certified that Margaret Kremer is the Widow of Michael Kremer deceased who was a Soldier in Captain Johnston's Company in the 10th Virginia Regiment, and who received a wound in the action at Brandywine [September 11, 1777] in the late War in consequence of which he died, And that the said Margaret continues a Widow, and lives in this County in indigent circumstances
