State Pension Application of Henry Carver VAS112  
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

[From [pension records in the Library of Virginia](#):]

I do with the advice of Council hereby Certify that Mary Carver, widow of Henry Carver, who was a private in the 8<sup>th</sup> Virg'a. Regiment, and died in the service of the Continent, is entitled to the sum of Eight Pounds yearly, to commence from the first day of January 1786.

Given under my hand at Richmond this 23<sup>d</sup> day of January 1786. P. Henry [Gov. Patrick Henry]

Frederick Sct. sep'r. Court 1787

Ordered that the Sheriff do pay Mary Carver eight pounds the amount of her Pension for last year agreeable to a Certificate from the Govnor & Council the having Complied with the Law

Rec'd the within Order of the Sheriff of Frederick the 9<sup>th</sup> Sep'r. 1787 Mary herXmark Carver

I do hereby Certify that Henry Carver enlisted into the Service of the United States in the 8<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment for the War, and that he died in Service.
