Virginia Bounty-Warrant Claim of Richard Dunn VAS1139

At a Court held for James City County Sept'r 11th 1780

A Certificate from Colo. J. Allison [John Allison] of Richard Dunns having served as a Soldier three years in the first Virginia State Regiment and another Certificate from Robert Andrews a Justice of the said County of the said Dunn's having made Oath before him of his never before proving, or claiming his Right to Land for the Service aforesaid, were produced & read & ordered to be certified & recorded.

Richard Dunn 1 March 1777 com'd Terry Town [probably Tarrytown NY]
