Wm. Atkinson has served as a soldier in the Corps commanded by Lt. Colo. [Henry] Lee from 20th March 1781 to 31 December of the same year when he was disabled by a number of wounds & has never since joined the Army from that circumstance – he was supposed dead & by that means omitted in the return given to Colo. Meriwether – he was enlisted for the War & was taken from Colo. Campbells [Richard Campbell's 4th] Regiment of Virginians & annexed to the Legion.

I DO, with the advice of the Council, hereby certify that William Atkinson about 27 [first digit unclear], late a Private in Lee's Legion, appears to have been disabled in such a manner while in the service of The Continent as to entitle him to the sum of Twelve Pounds yearly; which allowance is accordingly made him, to commence from the first day of January 1786

I hereby certify that William Atkinson a disabled soldier of the revolutionary Army, and who was a pensioner, died on my land (being a tenant) in February 1814, to the best of my knowledge & belief. He left a widow, Sarah Atkinson, & a Daughter, also called Sarah Atkinson.

To the Honorable, the Legislature of the commonwealth of Virginia.

The Petition of William Atkinson of the county of Caroline humbly represents to your honorable body, That in consequence of disabilities received in the service of his Country during the revolutionary war, your Petitioner was placed on the pension list, and has annually received the sum of Forty dollars: But as the Corporeal disabilities of your Petitioner increase with his years, he is less able to labour now than formerly, when aided by the bounty of his Country he could by his own industry support his family. In consideration therefore of the services formerly rendered the Country by your Petitioner, of his having been in great measure deprived of the means of supporting himself and family in that service, and of the old age and infirmities which now press upon your Petitioner, He humbly asks your honourable body to increase his pension to Sixty Dollars, and your Petitioner, as in duty bound will ever pray
