Virginia Pension Claim of David Blanks VAS1216
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

[From Revolutionary pension records in the Library of Virginia.]

In the October Session 1778 there was an act passed by the Assembly of Virginia, that David Blanks a Soldier in my company of Artillery who was Lawfully discharged, on acc't. of one of his hands being Injured by a Cannon, should Receive for his present Relief Thirty pounds, & Thirty pound pr. year for Three years after. he has Received One years pay. I Rece'd. the money & the Rec't. may be found in the Treasurers office

Given under my hand this 17th day of Sep'r 1792

In Council Oct 4, 1792

The Auditor will grant a Certificate to David Blanks enabling him to receive the balance of pension due him. [signed illegibly]

Sir Please to pay John Goodwyn the balance due from the Treasurer of Virginia to me. thier was an act pass'd by the Virginia Assembly in the October Session 1778 directing the Treasurer to pay me a [illegible] sum of money which act may be found on the Journals.
