Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

## [From bounty land records in the Library of Virginia]

Virginia Charlotte County Court 8<sup>th</sup> November 1814

On the motion of Thomas Jones it is ordered that the following Testimony the entered of Record – "Cadwallader Jones came into court and made oath that David Jones an only Brother of Thomas Jones was enlisted in the regular Service for three years by Captain John Brent of Charlotte County and died in the Service in the year 1777 or 1778 – Samuel White also made oath that David Jones Brother of Thomas Jones did serve his apprenticeship with [text to faint to discern] after a few years he enlisted as a Soldier under Captain John Brent for the Term of three years in the regular service – Lewelling Jones another witness also made oath that he well recollects that David Jones who died in the service of the United States in 1777 or 1778 was enlisted in the United States Service for three years from the County of Charlotte by Captain John Brent and it is further ordered that the Court Certify that the said Cadwallader Jones, Samuel White & Lewelling Jones the three deposing witnesses are persons of credibility."

Loyd Portwood of the above County came before me a Justice of the peace for the said County & made oath that he well recollects that David Jones who died in the Service of the United States in the year 1778 or 1777 was enlisted in the said service in the year 1775 for the term of three years from the County of Charlotte by Captain John Brent.
