[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indcipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

The State of Indiana Dearborn County Sct.

I David Haney aged sixty-five years a Citizen of the United States do upon oath testify and declare that in the year 1782 I enlisted in the Army of the revolution against the Common enemy of my Country for the term of during the war and Served in the Company commanded by Captain Bedkins under the command of Colonel Among [Col. Charles Armand Tuffin, Marquis de la Rouerie] of the Virginia line and that I continued in the service aforesaid until the close of the war in 1783 when I was regularly discharge from the Regiment commanded by Colonel Among my discharge is now lost or Mislaid so that I cannot produce it to corroborate this above Statement. I further declare that I have never received a warrant for my services in the Virginia Continental line the bounty land promised to me on the part of the United States nor have I never sined [assigned?] or transferred my claim to that gratuity in any manner whatever therefore know all men by these presents that I William Dixson [sic] aforesaid constitute and appoint Nathaniel Bearsley living in Brown County State of Ohio to be my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name to demand and receive from the Secretary of war of the United States or of such other persons as duly authorized to issue and deliver same a warrant for the quantity of land due to me as aforesaid and to sign & receipt or acceptance therefore and my said attorney is hereby fully authorized and empowered to constitute and appoint one or more substitutes or others under him for the special purpose above whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 31st day of May 1827.
