Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

I do Certify that I enlisted James Peake the 29 November 1776 to serve in the 2nd Virginia Regiment of Continental Troops for the war & that he died July 1778

Passed S/ Cha. Jones Comt. S/ John P. Harrison, Capt.
2nd V. Regimt.

I Joseph Peake Father of James Peake do hereby empower Frances Paylor to settle with the Auditors of Public Accounts and receive from them Certificates for the Amount of the pay due for my son's services in the Continental Army and also to receive the bounty or Lands. Given under my hand this 11th day of April 1785
