I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." It appears from the Register in this Office that Wm Peers served as a Drummer in the Continental line & that he received for depreciation Seventy pounds 18/S on the 27 April '86 collected by Thomas Peers

This day Thomas Peers came before me and made Oath that the within mentioned William Peers his Brother was Enlisted as a Drummer in the Continental line for three years and he being the legal representative of said William Peers Deceased settled his claims with the Auditor of Public Accounts.
