
[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

I Benjamin Dickerson [?] of the County of Caroline do hereby assign to Edmund Clark of the same County his heirs and assigns forever all my right to the Claim and demand whatever which I have to the Bounty of two hundred acres of Land given by the State of Virginia to George Holloway deceased late soldier enlisted in the sixth Regiment during the war and which descended to me in right of my wife Elizabeth his only sister & Heir at Law – and I desire that the register may Issue a warrant for the said two hundred acres of land in the name of the said Edmund Clark. Given under my hand & seal this 18<sup>th</sup> [?] day of June in the year of our Lord 1784
