Virginia Pension Claim of William Graham VAS1642



[The following is in [rejected claims in the Library of Virginia](#) misfiled under the name Grady, William. This, together with other documents, are also among [bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia](#), but the online images are illegible.]

I do hereby Certify that William Graham was a Soldier in the Seventh Virginia Regiment of Continental Troops, he was in the Service two years to my knowledge, I was a Lieutenant in said Reg't. and Belonged to the same company said graham did, I was the Person that Enlisted him into the Service we were ten or Eleven months together in morgans Core of Riflemen [sic: Daniel Morgan's Rifle Corps] Said graham was with morgan at the takeing of Burgoines army to the North [sic: Burgoyne's Army captured at Saratoga on 17 Oct 1777], where he was in several hard Actions and always behaved as a Bold Soldier.
