



To the honorable the Speaker & Gentlemen of the House of Delegates The Petition of James Armstrong of the County of Henry humbly sheweth that where as in An Expedition against the Tories he rode a valuable Horse on the Occasion which Horse was stolen by the said Kind of People Wherefore your Petitioner prays redress out of the Tory Property now in the Possession of Certain military Officers of Henry County Friends to the Liberties of these States The valuation of the said Horse will appear by Certificate annexed for which your Petitioner as in Duty will ever pray &c.

Henry County October the 24<sup>th</sup> 1780. James Armstrong Came before me and made Oath that he Sustained the Loss of a mare Taken from him by the Torys, which said mare is appraised by James Shelton & James Spencer upon Oath to be worth Thirty pounds Old Tennor [tender], which Loss the said Armstrong submits to the Assembly of Virginia for Redress Given under my hand
