To the honorable the Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Delegates of the Commonwealth of Virginia

The Petition of Peachy Bledsoe Humbly sheweth That your petitioner enlisted on the 17th of February 1777 as a Sergeant in the second Virginia State Regiment and continued to serve therein until the 17th of February 1780 when he was duly discharged as will appear by his vouchers – that Immediately after his discharge and before obtaining a certificate of the arears due to him from the Commonwealth he removed to the State of Georgia and became a resident thereof where it was not in his power to settle his accounts or know the time limitted by Law for that purpose

your petitioner therefore humbly prays that the General assembly will take his case into consideration and make such provision for the payment of what shall appear to be due to him as our honorable Body shall think just and reasonable



To the Honorable the Speakers & Members of the General Assembly the petition of Peachy Bledsoe respectfully sheweth

that your petitioner inlisted on the 17th of February 1777 as a Sergeant in the 2nd Virginia State Regiment and served therein untill the 17th day February in the year 1780, when he was duly discharged as will appear by his Vouchers.

That immediately after his discharge, and before obtaining a Certificate of the Arrears due to him from the Commonwealth, he removed into the State of Georgia and became a Resident thereof where it was not in his power to settle his Accounts, or know the time limited by Law for that purpose.

Your petitioner therefore prays that your Hon'ble Houses will take his case into consideration, and make such provision for the payment of what shall appear to be due him as your Wisdom may dictate. And as in duty bound He will pray
