I do hereby Certify that Mr. Jesse Walton was properly appointed as Brigade Quarter Master to the 2nd Militia Brigade the fourteenth day of July, & acted in that capacity until the first day of the present months. Given under my Hand the 12th November 1781

[Robert Lawson, Brigadier General Militia]

Know all Men Whoom it may concern that I Wm. Walton of the state of Georgia Richmond County do hereby Assign all my right Claim & Interest in any wages due Jesse Walton Deceased as Quarter Master in Genl Lawsons Brigade & Quarter master in the Southern Department under Genl Stephens [sic: Edward Stevens] To whom I am Legal Heir to, to Matthew Walton of Amelia County
Given under my Hand the 10th Day of Aug't. 1786

1790 October 28 Amelia County 2293-a

(Petition not located 20 January 1965)

Journal of House of Delegates, 1790, p. 23:

“Also a petition of William Walton, setting forth, that he is the heir at law of Jesse Walton, deceased, who in the year 1781, acted as a quartermaster to the second brigade of militia in the state, and did not during his life receive any compensation for his services, and praying that petitioner may now receive the same.”
