To The Hon'ble the Speaker & Gentlemen of the house of Delagaitis

The Petition of Isaac Ready humbly sheweth that yr. Petitioner was a soldier in the militia from the County of Bedford comm'n'd by Colo. [Charles] Lynch in the Ingagement at Gilford [sic: Guilford Courthouse NC, 15 Mar 1781] in which Ingagement he received a wound in his hip which has Cost your Petitioner much money & is still uncured – yr. Petitioner is a poor man with a wife & family of small Childen & has nothing to suporte them with but by his Labour which sence his misfortune he is not able to doe Yr Petitioner prays yr. honorable house will take his case under your consideration & allow him such Releafe as you in yr. wisdom shall [two undeciphered words] & yr. Pet'r. as in duty bound shall ever pray &c.

May 20<sup>th</sup> 1782 referred to [Committee on] Trade.

June 21 1782 Referred to the next Session of Assembly

November 1782 the Petitioner being dead & his Widow being relieved by a petition presented this Session not reported upon
