To the H<sup>'</sup>ble General Assembly of Virginia.

Your Petitioner Dan<sup>'</sup>l. Culp Humbly sheweth that in the year 1775 he was appointed a Lieutenant in the 8<sup>th</sup> Virginia Reg<sup>'</sup>t on Continental Establishment, that o the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1776 he was ordered on the recruiting service in which line he continued until the 12<sup>th</sup> of May 1777. That during the said term he inlisted eighty nine men, paid the expences of subsisting &c and their respective bounties. That on acct. of the said service he rec<sup>'</sup>d divers sums of money, to the amount of Two hundred & Eighty one pounds then shillings, which falls short of the sums expended and premiums allowed your petitioner for such services, That your Petitioner laid his acc<sup>'</sup>ts before the Court of Berkley [sic] which has been certified by them. But the Auditor of Publick Acc<sup>'</sup>lt not thinking himself Justifiable by the Laws now in force, to Issue a Certificate for the said claim. Your Petitioner therefore prays your H<sup>'</sup>ble House will take the same under consideration & direct that the Auditor may give your Petitioner a Certificate for what may be Justly due or grant him such other relief as to them shall seem best & yr petitioner shall pray &c.
