[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

To the Honorable the Speaker and Gentleman of the House of Delegates
The Petition of Samuel Venable Humbly Sheweth, that he was a Cornet in a Volunteer Corps of Dragoons from Prince Edward commanded by Capt. Watkins [probably Thomas Watkins] raised by the request of the Honorable Major General Green [Nathanael Greene] and after joining the Army was detached by Col. Washington [William Washington] on a reconnoitering party and was taken Prisoner by the Enemy – with his horse which horse was previously valued to 18.000 lbs of Tobacco. Your Petitioner prayeth that your Honorable House will make him such Satisfaction as in your wisdom shall seem right and your Petitioner as in Duty bound shall ever pray &c
