
To the Honble the Speaker of House of Delegates

The Petition of Elizth Trainum Humbly sheweth that Her husband Joshua Trainum did enlist in Service of his Country during the last war as an Eighteen months man and died in the service while on duty to the Southward Your petitioner begs leave to inform this Hon^{ble} House that she is extremely poor & has a house full of Children to mantain by her own body by labor She hopes & prays this Honble house will take her Case into Consideration & grant her such releive as they shall think proper & as in duty bound she will ever pray &c

I hereby Certify that some time in the year 1779 I inlisted Joshua Trainham to serve in my division as a soldier for eighteen months agreeably to law. Given under my hand this 29th day of October 1793
