Bounty Land Warrant information relating to Loveall [Lovell] Pierce VAS191 [vsl 2VA](#)

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." I Gray Samwell [sic, Gray Samuel]<sup>1</sup> of the State of Virginia and County of Caroline, do hereby certify that I was well acquainted with Lovell Pierce that he served in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Virginia Regiment and in the same company that I was orderly Sergeant of and that I fully believe he enlisted for 3 years & served that time in the Revolutionary War. Given under my hand this 26 day of July 1834
