## Petition relating to James Edwards VAS1937 Transcribed by Will Graves

Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indecipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

To the Honorable the Speakers and members of both houses of the Assembly
The Memorial and petition of Mary Edwards Relic of James Edwards late of the County
of Louisa Sheweth that on or about the month of October 1781 your Petitioner's Husband James
Edwards was in the Rotine [routine?] of duty ordered out as a soldier in the Louisa Militia, in the
defense of the State and that while he was in the Service, he died, leaving your petitioner with
five helpless children to raise, and no estate of consequence to support them on. Your
Memorialist has lately been told that in such cases the laws of the land have made some
provision to assist in supporting and bringing up the Orphans of those who died or were killed in
the service of their Country. Your petitioner therefore prays that the benefit of that law may
extend to her to the end that she may be enabled the better there with to Raise and qualify her
said five children to be useful citizens and your petitioner as in duty bound will pray &c
