This day David Irby [pension application S5602] appeared before me James M Williams a Justice of the Peace for the County of Pittsylvania in the State of Virginia and made oath that he was well acquainted with Armistead Dudley in the War of the Revolution. That they were both Soldiers in the Illinoise [sic: Illinois] Regiment in Captain Montgomerys [John Montgomery R16522] Company under Colo George Rogers Clark [VAS269] and was present when the Country called Illinoise was subdued and taken; that both himself and the said Dudley was honorably discharged, That the said Armistead Dudley reenlisted with Capta Edward Worthington [R19205] for during the War he left him in the Service and well remembers that he did not return to the County of Campbell where he then resided untill after the War had ended. That he knew the said Armistead Dudley and have frequently heard him say that he never did receive the land Bounty promised him for Services rendered in the Illinoise Regiment.
