Report being made to me [several undeciphered word], that Charles Robinson Soldier in the 7th Virginia Regiment is [several undeciphered words] Field or Garrison duty and he has applied for his discharge in preference to being [undeciphered word] in the Corps of [undeciphered word] agreeably to a Resolution of Congress of the Twenty Third of April 1782 [several undeciphered words] of the United States, and is entitled to receive as a pension five dollars pr. month in lieu of [undeciphered word] pay and Emoluments.

Given under my hand at Fort Pitt this 27th day of November 1782.

In Pursuance of the Direction of The Worshipfull Court of Ohio County. To Examine the Wounds of Charles Robinson. Who by undoubted Testimony appear's to have been a Soldier in the service of the State and Now Residing in Ohio County and that he received his wounds in the s'd. Service; I Do find a wound in his right arm near the shoulder still runing, which I adjudge to be occasioned by part of the bone remaining loose. That he well deserves the assistance allowed to other's under the Like Predicament Given under my hand this 10th day of May 1787. [signed] B. Johnston Surg'n.

Ordered by the Court, That it be certified to the Executive of this Commonwealth, that due Proof hath been made before us that Charles Robison is a Resident of Ohio County – that he hath been wounded in the Service of this Commonwealth. that he belonged to to the 7th Virg'a. Regiment. That he is now 50 years of Age and that he is unable as well as too Remote from the seat of Government to attend the Executive [several illegible words] of the Disability of the Applicant made out by the Surgeon Accompany the above Order.

I do with the advice of the Council hereby Certify That Charles Robinson, about 50 years of age, late a private in the 13th Virginia Regiment whose pay was at the rate of £24 per annum Was disabled in the service of the United States by a wound received in his right arm near the Shoulder; and that he is allowed the sum of Ten Pounds yearly, to commence from the first day of January 1787.

Given under my hand as Lieuten't. Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia (The Governor being absent) at Richmond this 16th day of June 1787
