received several Wounds by which he is disabled from gaining a livelihood by labour, is put on the list of Pensioners pursuant to an Act of assembly for allowing pensions to several persons, passed December 20th 1792 with an allowance of twelve pounds yearly commencing on the day of the passage of said act.

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia at Richmond this 3^d day of December 1793.

At a Court Held for Princess Anne County the 3^d day of July 1797 in the 21st year of the Commonwealth of Virginia

It appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that Henry Salmon a Pensioner was unable to attend this Court in person in the Months of April and March last This day appeared in person and on his Motion is Recommended To his Excellency the Governor for a continuance of his Pension and for the arrears thereof if any due him.
