
Virginia documents pertaining to John Smith VAS2118

It is hereby Certifyed that Jno. Smith late a pensioner, was a private in the 7th Virg'a Reg't, and received a wound, in the service of the United States by a Muskett Ball through his Hip or Thigh, that has rendered him a cripple, and remains unable to perform any hard labour. He is about 40 years of age. Given under my Hand this 2nd April 1787

I do with the advice of the Council hereby Certify That John Smith, aged about 40 years, late a private in the 7th Virginia Regiment, and whose pay was at the rate of £24 per annum, was wounded in the service of the United States by a Musket ball which passed through his Thigh or Hip and has rendered him a Cripple; And that he is allowed the sum of Twelve Pounds yearly to commence from the first day of January 1786.

Given under my hand as Lieutenant Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia (the Governor being Absent) at Richmond this 7th day of June 1787.
