

Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Simon Stacy VAS2121
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

I do with the advice of the Council hereby Certify That Sarah Stacy widow of Simon Stacy who was a private of the 15th Virginia Regiment [see endnote] and died in the service of The United States, Is entitled to the sum of Eight Pounds yearly, to commence from the first day of January 1786.

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia at Richmond this 18th day of January 1787.

At a Court held for Sussex County the 19th day June 1788.

Sarah Stacy a pensioner from her Certificate as the Law directs sworn to before Peter Jones, a Justice of the Peace, and comparing the same with the Pension List and finding it right –

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County pay her Eight Pounds out of the Public Money in his hands.

Copy Teste/ Mich'l. Bailey C. Cur.

Rec'd of George Rines Sheriff Sussex County the sum of Eight Pounds as above mentioned as my Pension allow'd me.
