Louis County June Court 1786

Joseph Watkins aged thirty Four years and upwards being heretofore summon'd to appear at this Court to give an account of the [illegible word] of his wounds by him [illegible word] in the service of the United States this day appear'd and proved to [the satis]faction of the Court that [illegible word] under the command of Colo Aylett [probably Thomas Elliott] in Capt. [Oliver] Towles Company (at the Battle of Brandywine [11 Sep 1777]) in the [?]<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment received a wound and it appears to the Court that the said wound is nearly in the same situation it was in when the said Watkins was allowed first his pension

I DO, with the advice of the [Cou]ncil, hereby certify that Joseph Watkins of Louisa, aged about [?] late a Private in the Sixth Virg'a Regiment, appears to have been disabled in such a manner while in the service of the United States as to entitle him to the sum of Twelve Pounds yearly; which allowance is [\*]ingly made him, to commence from the first day of [Ja]nuary 1786
