Virginia documents pertaining to John Wheeler VAS2135

I do with the advice of Council hereby certify that John Wheeler late a private in the state line and disabled in the service of this Commonwealth, is put on the list of Pensioners pursuant to an Act of the General Assembly passed at the present session, with an allowance of eight pounds yearly, commencing the first day of January one thousand seven hundred and ninety two.

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia at Richmond this 13<sup>th</sup> day of December 1791.
