


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

the sum of one hundred & fifty dollars allow'd me for present relief by an act of the General assembly  
passed on the 14th day of January 1812 intituled an act placing James Willson on the pention list and for  
his present relief

I James Willson of the County of Wythe formerly of the County of Rockbridge and State of  
Virginia do hereby Constitute and appoint Montgomery Friel of s'd County of Wythe my my lawful  
attorney to receive in my behalf of the Auditor my pension for six months as an Invalid of the State from  
the 14<sup>th</sup> day of July 1819 and ending on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of January 1820 as witness my hand and seal this 8<sup>th</sup>  
day of May 1821
