I do Certify that Lieutenant Colonel Jonathan Clark is entitled to the proportion of land allowed a Lieutenant Col. in the Virginia Continental line for Military Service from the 4th of march 1776 to this day.

The is a Copy of a Certificate on which a Warrant for 7000 Acres issued to Jonathan Clark for 7 years Service.

May 25th 1807

I do Certify that Colonel Clark served in the Continental Army to the final Close of the war, which was deemed to be the 15th November 1783.
