Virginia documents pertaining to John Addison VAS2187

I certify that Hillary Mears [Hilary Mears, pension application S18508] who is a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that he was well acquainted with John Addison of this County in the time of the Revolutionary War – and that said Addison enlisted in the 9<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment and went with that Regiment to the north and was absent between four & five years – that he the Witness served in Capt. [William] Polk's company of militia during the time of the War & recollects [undeciphered word] Addison's enlistment as aforesaid, & that he was absent as above stated, and he always understood that he was in service all the time of his absence from the County. Witness my hand & seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1833 as a Justice of the peace in & for Accomack County. Wm. R Custis JP

I certify that Levin Hyslop [W7858] who is Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that he served from the year 1775, December, till the War was ended in the Virginia Continental line, & has drawn 200 acres of Land for his services aforesaid and that he was well acquainted with John Addison in the time of the War & that said Addison was a soldier & in service in the Continental line more than three years with the witness, and he believes nearly or quite five years. Witness my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for the County of Accomack June 17<sup>th</sup> 1833
