City of Richmond Set

John Agnew this day personally appeared before me an Alderman for the said City, and made oath that he served three years in the Revolutionary Army, that his Discharge was sent on to the City of Washington for the purpose of obtaining a pension where it now remains and that he has never applied for or received Land bounty for said service.

Sworn to this 5<sup>th</sup> day of March, 1819.
