


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Jesse Andrews VAS2253
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

[The following are from [rejected claims in the Library of Virginia](#):]

The affidavit of Jesse King [pension application S5559] of Surry County of Virginia taken at his dwelling house in the said county the 28th day of May 1834

The affiant being duly sworn saith that he is in the seventy ninth year of his age and that he was well acquainted with Jesse Andrews of the said county before & during the Revolutionary War, & that he knows that the said Jesse Andrews in the year 1776 inlisted in the service of the United States in the Virginia State line on continental establishment in the company raised and commanded by Captain John Watkins, and went to the North in the said company which was attached to the fourth Virginia Regiment and it was always understood that he died in the service; he certainly never came back again, the term for which he the said Jesse Andrews and the whole of Watkins company enlisted for, was three years: and this affiant was one of them, and served his full term of three years.
