I Wm Cannon certify that Anthony Barnes a Soldier of the revolutionary war, was a private in Capt Tabbs company, that he served about four years and died in the service. Given under my hand this 3rd July 1832

Princess Ann County to wit:

I Jon Hunter hereby certify that William Cannon this day made oath to the above certificate before me.
Given under my hand and seal this 3rd July 1832 Jon Hunter J.P/

I Thomas Bonny [Thomas Bonney S6688] certify that Anthony Barnes enlisted in the regular army of the revolution and never returned home afterwards. I further certify that I have frequently heard he died in the service

Given under my hand July 9th 1832
