Know all men by these presents that I Benjamin Bartlett of the County of Prince Edward have this day Bargained & sold & by these Presents do bargain sell and Convey to Aron Smith the bounty of Land that is due me from the State of Virginia in consideration of my services as a soldier to the end of the war in Lieut. David Walkers Comp'y in Colo Febigars [sic: Christian Febiger VAS675] Regiment of Continental Troops and on Receipt of the bounty of Land aforesaid a Suf^t discharge for me and my name Grant and I do hereby Ratify and Confirm all and whatsoever he the said Aron Smith may do in touching the Premises aforesaid In witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 16th day of April 1796
