1822 October the 10<sup>th</sup> personally appeared before me George Walker a Justice of the peace in and for Monroe County Francis Meddows [Francis Meadows W5367] and made oath that he knew William Bausewill and the said Bausewill inlisted as a soldier for three years in the revelutionary war under David Land and Cpt Land was broke of his Commition [sic: commission; see endnote] and the said William Bausewill served the remainder of his time under Nathan Lamb [sic: Nathan Lamme S46454] he the said Bausewell was taken prisoner at Charleston in S Carolina [12 May 1780] and never returned again [two or three undeciphered words]

Sworn to before me the day & year first above writen      George Walker

NOTE: I could find no record of a Capt. David Land.
