THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof William Bedworth Private Soldier in the Invalid regiment, having faithfully served the United States Six years and Seven months and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 18<sup>th</sup> day of August 1783

By order of the secretary at war,

B. Lincoln [Benjamin Lincoln]

Jos. [undeciphered] Sec'y

Registered in the books of the regiment,

[undeciphered signature] adjutant.

War office, August 18<sup>th</sup> 1783.

THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace; previous to which time, and until proclamation thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough.
