The heirs of Wm Bennett claim Bounty Land for his services for the term of during the War in the Va Cont'l line as a soldier

Parker Copes [S39350] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that he served on tour of 18 months in Capt Parkers [Thomas Parker] Company of the 11th Va Regiment in the Continental line in the Revolutionary War & that William Bennett served as a soldier in said Regiment whilst he the Witness was in said Company, & that s'd Bennett remained in service till the War ended. Witness my hand & seal March 20th 1833 at Accomack CH. Va. Wm. R. Custis JP.

Spencer Killam [Spencer Kellam W1178] a Revolutionary Pensioner & a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that he served one tour of 18 months in Capt. Parkers Company of the 11th Virginia Regiment, Cont'l line, in the Revolutionary War, & that William Bennett was a soldier in s'd Company whilst he the witness served in s'd Company & that s'd Bennett remained in service till the end of the War. Witness my hand & seal March 21st 1833 Wm. R. Custis JP

John Charnock Sen'r [S38598] made oath before me that he served one term of 18 months in Capt Thos Parkers Company of the 11th Va Regiment Cont'l Line, in the Revolutionary War, & that William Bennett enlisted to serve as a soldier in s'd Company for the term of during the War & that he did serve till the War ended and I certify that s'd Charnock is a man of truth & veracity. Witness my hand & seal at Accomack CH March 22^d 1833 Wm. R. Custis JP
