Virginia documents pertaining to Charles Beverly VAS2505

At a Court held for Buckingham County this 12th Day of May 1783.
Jane & Priscilla Beverly [undeciphered word] mullattoes; Heirs of Charles Beverley deceased a Mulatto
Produced a Certificate signed by John Nicholas [S46394] and signifying that the said Charles Beverley
regularly enlisted under him a Continental Soldier for the term of three years who [several undeciphered
words] discharging is duty in the said Service before the term had quite expired and the said Jane &
Priscilla claiming a right to the Land allowed by Law for his service which is Ordered to be Certified to
His Excellency the Governor and Council. a Copy Teste Rolfe Eldridge Cl. Court

The within Certificate is wrong in respect to the two women claiming as heirs to Char's Beverley, he
having left brothers – Charles Beverley's will (the only good claim they can have) must be certified by the
Court before they can get what their Brother was justly entitled to. J. Nicholas jun.

I do hereby Certify That the within mentioned Charles Beverly decd made a Will wherein he left all that
he was possessed off to the within Jane & Priscilla Beverly which Will is of record in the Court of
Buckingham County. Given under my hand this 7th day of May 1784.
