Wood County to wit.

This day appeared, personally before me, a Justice of the peace in and for the County aforesaid, Bailey Rice [S39044] of the said County, aged seventy years and upwards and made oath that he was personally acquainted with Simon Peter Boley commonly known by the name of Peter Boley and that he was an Enlisted Soldier for three years in the war of the Revolution and died in the service of his Country and that Simon Boley, his son, of Fauquier County Va. is the only remaining heir of said Simon P. Boley.

Given under my hand this 26th day of July 1834 H L Prestiss JP

To His Excellency David Campbell – Gov. of Virginia

Your memorialist Simon Boley, heir at law of Simon P. Boley, late of Fauq Co Virg'a respectfully represents, that said his said father enlisted for three years in the army of the Revolution, and he believes in the Virg'a Con'tl Line, and whilst in said service he died. Your memorialist prays that Virg'a land bounty for said service may be allowed and he will &c
