


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Fauquier County

I do certify that I knew Joseph Braday, an excellent sergeant under my command at charleston during the revolution – he enlisted for 3 years as a sergeant and served his time faithfully – he then enlisted to serve during the war as a sergeant, and did so as faithfully as any man. I knew him well – he is now dec'd – both terms of his service were in the Va. Continental line. Given under my hand this 30th Sept 1822. Jo. Blackwell [Joseph Blackwell S37781] Late
Capt. 6th [undeciphered] cont'l Reg't
