
Virginia documents pertaining to Charles Broadfield VAS2660

Charles Broadfield [undeciphered word] Soldier in the 11th Virg'a Regiment in the service of the United States of America, having served the full Term of his enlistment, is now Discharged from any future service in the said Regiment.

Given under my hand at Camp this 6th Day of December 1779.

James Wood [BLWt2419-500] Colo. Comd. 1st V. Brigade

Affidavit of James Casey [S9158].

The affiant being duly sworn sayeth that he is now seventy four years of age that he was a Soldier of the Revolution, that he enlisted under Capt. Henry Pitt [see endnote] in the Virginia Continental line fifteen Regiment [see endnote] in the early part of the war; that the Regiment was Commanded by Colonel David Mason [VAS506], that he served three years in the 15th Regiment, and was honorably discharged and now draws a pension from the United States of eighty dollars per year; that he was well acquainted with Charles Broadfield and Lemuel Murphy and John Fowler and Randal West [Randolph West VAS2661] and Thomas Gale and Giles Bowery [Giels Bowry VAS2587], and Obadiah Bullock, all of the above named soldiers belonged to the 15th Continental Regiment to which I was attached and we all went on to the North & served three years together. Another Soldier by the name of [illegible] Bracey also enlisted for three years in the same Regiment with me and we went on to the north together and was killed in service at Germantown battle [4 Oct 1777], the above named Soldiers were all from the County of Isle of Wight in which County I then lived & now live. Given under my hand & seal this 26th day of July 1833.

NOTE: The 15th Virginia Continental Regiment became the 11th Virginia Continental Regiment on 14 Sep 1778.
