I certify that William Callis served in the [undeciphered word] Regiment with me in the Revolutionary War – to wit the first Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment] – for the space of three years as a private.

Henry Buchanan [S37807]

[York County VA, 6 March 1832]

William Challis a soldier of infantry in the Va line on continental establishment, received on the 21 May 1784 by Rob't Challis, a certificate for £36.8. for the balance of his full pay or depreciation; and Minson Proby a Sarjeant of Cavalry in the same line received by George Booker, a certificate for £71.5.2 which issued on the 14 April 1785
