Certified that Joseph Carr inlisted in Dec'r 1776 for the Term of Three years that he afterwards before the expiration of that time reinlisted for the war, and Continued in Service as a Serjent till the 20<sup>th</sup> of May 1781 when he was killed at the [undeciphered word] of Camden in South Carolina [see endnote].

NOTE: Joseph Carr was apparently mortally wounded at the battle of Hobkirk Hill near Camden SC on 25 Apr 1781. Samuel Hawes as Lt. Col. commanded the 2<sup>nd</sup> Virginia Regiment at the battle. Del'd Capt Coleman.
