


I do hereby certify that I was acquainted with Thomas Carr, now deceased, who was in the month of February 1781, in the occupation of a Waggoner, in one of the Virginia regiments on Continental establishment, and that the said Carr continued in the service until the conclusion of the War.

Given under my hand this 6<sup>th</sup> day of August 1811.
