Virginia documents pertaining to Thomas C. Carroll VAS2908

State of Virginia/ Albemarle County to wit  
Personally appeared before me the subscriber a justice of the peace for the s'd County Absalom Pugh who being first duly qualified according to law, Declares on oath that Thomas C. Carrol was a soldier in the war of the revolution & that he knew of his enlisting into the service under [blank] in the County of Albemarle and that he served in the [blank] that he has long since departed this life & died in the service of his Country leaving five children vis Sarah, Nancy, Martha, Henry & Charles, since which time Charles has died leaving also four vis, Wm M. Carrol, John W. Carrol, David Carrol & George Carrol the only heirs & legal representatives of the s'd Charles Carrol deceased, and that he very believes he never did receive his bounty lands & that no one since entitled to it has it has received it That they claim the same as the heirs & legal representatives of the s'd Thomas C. Carrol. Given from under my hand & seal this the 25 day of June 1842.

Albemarle County to wit  
Personally appeared before the undersigned a justice of the peace for the county aforesaid in the state of Va. Elizabeth Kirby who being first duly sworn according to law declares on oath that she was well acquainted with Thomas C. Carrol who lived at the time she was acquainted with him on the Rivanna River in the county aforesaid and married a Miss Nuckols  
In testimony whereof the said Elizabeth Kirby has hereunto set her hand and affixed her seal this 5<sup>th</sup> day of July 1842
