I do hereby certifie that Benjamin Casey Decd was a Lieut. in Cap. Stephen Ashbys [Stephen Ashby BLWt2420-300] Comp'y on the the Western waters in the year 1776 and that, that comp'y was considered as one of the company's of the Twelfth Reg't commanded by Colonel James Wood: that he was promoted to a Captaincy in said Regiment the first day of September 1777 and that he continued as such untill his death, which happen'd the fourteenth day of April 1779. Certified this 2d May 1783.
