Monroe County } [12 Sep 1834]

I, David Nowlin, Clerk of the Circuit Court of said county do certify that it is proven in open court to the satisfaction of the said court, that the within named Henry Biron, was a soldier in the revolution, in the Illinois Regiment, commanded by Col. George Rogers Clarke [sic: George Rogers Clark VAS269], that he served between three and four years, When the regiment was discharged and that He never received a Warrant for the Bounty Land promised him, either on the part of the United States or the State of Virginia, nor did he ever transfer his Claim to it in any manner whatsoever. It is further proven that the said Henry Biron died intestate and that the within subscribers to this instrument are his children and Heirs.
